Rotary Disaster Relief Response By Rotary Regions In Oregon (Counties)

Lane Co: Disaster Relief Assistance: \$157,977

Rotary Clubs of Eugene, Eugene Emerald Valley, Eugene Delta, Eugene Airport, Eugene Metropolitan, Eugene Southtowne, Springfield, Springfield Twin Rivers, Fern Ridge and Florence

The ten clubs in Lane County will be partnering with numerous local organizations in support of the response to the COVID 19 pandemic. Here is a summary of the efforts underway.

- \$50,000 for Fifteenth Night Project for Safety First Shelter for homeless youth.
- \$40,000 for scholarships for graduating seniors in need in Florence.
- \$20,000 to Habitat for Humanity Fischer Village
- \$6,000 for Disaster Grant for Lane County Food Banks for Food and Sanitary Supplies
- \$5,477 for Food Box Program
- \$1,000 to Eugene Education Fund to help vulnerable students' families with household supplies and groceries.
- \$1,000 to Food for Lane County for food assistance
- \$1,000 to Centro Latino for families in need
- \$3,000 to Looking Glass for needs to serve unhoused youth, including a washer and dryer and other supplies at a drop-in center
- Delivering weekly activity kits for children at the First Place Family Shelter, a transitional family shelter run by St. Vincent de Paul for unhoused families
- \$8,500 to Volunteers in Medicine Clinic with local matching
- \$5,000 to Belly Full weekend food for school kids
- \$3,500 - to 15th Night Food Pantry at Willamette High School- Rotarians provided renovation of pantry facility and needed equipment for food storage and preparation.
- \$1,600 to the Eugene Mission for food and other essentials
- \$2,000 for Food for Lane County providing food and volunteering to help assemble food boxes.
- \$2,400 to Project Amigo in Mexico for food boxes
- \$500 Express Grant for Food for the homeless
- \$2,000 in funding for Florence Food Share
- \$500 for the PeaceHealth Peach Harbor Foundation's local Covid-19 fund
- \$2,000 to fund coronavirus information initiatives in Tororo, Uganda

- \$15,000 in collaboration with the Sunriver Women's Club to fund South Deschutes County Food Distributors including, La Pine Community Kitchen, La Pine Senior Center, and La Pine Food Bank.
- \$24,000 to the Family Access Network (FAN) from the Rotary Disaster Relief Grant for families and individuals in six communities who will be receive food vouchers to purchase their own groceries at participating local grocery stores. The Redmond Kiwanis Club joined our effort with \$2,000 in additional funding.
- \$5,000 to United Way for those in need
- \$500 donation to the Bendfood.org project to provide food donations to local charities.
- \$1,250 to provide 120 meals for St Charles Hospital medical & janitorial staff in Redmond
- \$2,000 donated to the Madras Food Bank
- Donated 100 - KN95 masks to Redmond Fire and Rescue

- \$9,000 Providing hand sanitizer from the recently certified maker of the safety product and donation of Medical Equipment to Coos-Bay Local Medical facilities to local Coos County first responders and frontline healthcare workers.
- \$2,000 donated to The Patient Support Fund at the Newport hospital
- Provided meals for an entire day to the workers at Samaritan Hospital
- \$500 donated to support emergency supplies for children in Foster Parent program
- \$3,000 donated to Food Share
- \$3,000 to Salvation Army which will be used for community members in crisis who cannot pay their utility bills.
- \$5,500 to the Olalla Center from various Rotary clubs
- Coquille Rotary has been donating money to Frazier’s Bakery to help cover their losses from cancellation of our weekly meeting
- \$6,500 in cash donations to the “Common Good” and “Meals for Neighbors” partner programs for food distribution through the “Port Orford Senior Center.” Rotary volunteers estimate that 200 cars came through the Port Orford Senior Center distribution center in one day.

Jackson County – Disaster Relief Assistance: \$40,710

Rotary Clubs of Jackson Applegate, Upper Rogue-Eagle Point, Rogue Valley After 5, Bear Creek Valley, Medford, Greater Medford, Medford Rogue, Central Point, Ashland Lithia Springs, Ashland.

The ten clubs in Jackson County will be partnering with numerous local organizations in support of the response to the COVID 19 pandemic. Here is a summary of the efforts underway.

- \$3,600 - The Rotary Clubs of Jackson County have teamed up to partner with “Food and Friends” To distribute food to the homeless, homebound and hungry. “Food and Friends” delivers meals to the homes of seniors who are unable to shop or prepare meals due to illness, injury, or disability. Rotary estimates that they will be able to provide 665 meals for homebound seniors.
- *10 Rotary clubs Collaborative for a Rotary/Red Cross Blood Drive on May 5th*
- *\$4,250 worth of gift cards to locally owned food vendors and restaurants, with delivery and takeout services, for 350 elementary children needing food.*
- *\$7,500 for 300 food boxes will be distributed to families in need*
